AS THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC SLOWED, 2022 WAS A YEAR WHERE OUR TEAM WAS ABLE TO ONCE AGAIN FOCUS ON STRENGTHENING OUR RELATIONSHIPS WITH THE FOR-PROFIT DRILLERS WE HIRE TO IMPLEMENT PROJECTS IN THE COMMUNITIES WE SERVE WITH ALL OF OUR WATER PROJECTS. THANKS TO THE ADDITION OF A COUPLE NEW IN-COUNTRY TEAM MEMBERS, OUR RELATIONSHIPS WITH THESE FOR-PROFIT DRILLERS HELPED TO EFFICIENTLY COMPLETE ALL OF THIS WORK UNDER THE DIRECTION OF, AND IN COORDINATION WITH, OUR IN-COUNTRY STAFF. THESE STAFFERS ARE ALL NATIONALS FROM THEIR OWN COUNTRY WITHIN WHICH THEY WORK. AS WE HAVE ALWAYS DONE IN THE PAST, WE INVESTED HEAVILY IN GROWING OUR TEAM SPECIFICALLY WITHIN THE KINGDOM OF ESWATINI LAST YEAR, WHICH WE PLAN TO CONTINUE TO DO IN THE YEAR AHEAD.

WE EXPERIENCED A SLIGHT UPTICK IN THE PRODUCTION OF CLEAN WATER PROJECTS IN THE KINGDOM OF ESWATINI IN 2022. IN A COUNTRY WHERE NEARLY 1/5 OF THE ENTIRE NATION HAS CONTRACTED HIV/AIDS, CLEAN WATER PLAYS A MAJOR ROLE IN COMBATING THE EFFECTS OF THESE EXTREMELY DEADLY DISEASES.

IN 2022, WE WERE ABLE TO PROVIDE ANOTHER 4,500 **UGANDANS ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER.**

OPERATIONS STAFFING

THIRST PROJECT HIRES LOCAL NATIONALS FROM EACH COUNTRY THAT WE BUILD PROJECTS IN TO OVERSEE AND LEAD THE FIELD IMPACT WITHIN THEIR OWN COUNTRY. THESE IN-COUNTRY STAFFERS SERVES AS THE NUCLEUS BETWEEN ALL OF THE COMMUNITIES WE WORK WITH, THE FOR-PROFIT HYDROLOGISTS & DRILLERS WE HIRE TO BUILD OUR PROJECTS, AND OUR TEAM BACK IN THE UNITED STATES. EACH COUNTRY DIRECTOR OR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OFFICER LEADS THEIR IN-COUNTRY TEAM TO SUPPORT ALL OF THEIR WORK IN THE FIELD. THIS COST REPRESENTS THE TOTAL AMOUNT SPENT IN 2022 ON CHARGES RELATED TO ALL OPERATIONAL EXPENSES IN THE FIELD.

WATER AND SANITATION & HYGIENE

WE DON'T JUST BUILD CLEAN WATER PROJECTS! ACCESS TO SAFE WATER IS ONLY EFFECTIVE IN REDUCING DISEASE & MORTALITY WHEN IT'S PAIRED WITH GOOD SANITATION AND BETTER HYGIENE PRACTICES. WHEN WE BUILD A WATER PROJECT IN A COMMUNITY, WE ALSO TRAIN THOSE LOCAL COMMUNITIES ON SANITATION AND HYGIENE. WHEN COMBINED TOGETHER, THE RESULTS LITERALLY SAVES LIVES.





SUSTAINABILITY PRACTICES

MEASURES SUSTAINABILITY IS OUR #1 CORE VALUE IN THE FIELD. APPROPRIATE AND COMMUNITY ACCORDING TO THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION ENGAGEMENT ARE IN PLACE. OUR STRINGENT (WHO), THE AVERAGE LIFE SPAN OF A WATER WELL IN PROCESS FOR WORKING WITH LOCAL FOR-PROFIT AFRICA IS 4 YEARS, AND THE FAILURE RATE OF HYDROLOGISTS TO CARRY OUT HYDROLOGY & BOREHOLE WELLS IMPLEMENTED BY NGO'S ON THE GROUNDWATER SURVEYS BEFORE WE EVER DRILL, CONTINENT IS UPWARDS OF 60% WITHIN THE FIRST 4 ALLOWS US TO ENSURE THAT THE WATER TABLES WE TAP INTO ARE ADEQUATE TO MEET THE NEEDS OF YEARS. THIS IS ALARMINGLY HIGH, AND TOTALLY UNACCEPTABLE, AS MOST "FAILURES" ARE COMPLETELY THE PEOPLE WE SERVE. PREVENTABLE IF THE FOLLOWING SUSTAINABILITY









SUSTAINABILITY PRACTICES

WE COMPLETE TO GUARANTEE ALL OF OUR WATER IS SAFE IN-COUNTRY SIMILARLY, OUR STAFF ENSURE THAT EVERY COMMUNITY WE WORK WITH ELECTS A WATER COMMITTEE FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION. FINALLY, EACH COMMUNITY COMPRISED OF AN EQUAL NUMBER OF MEN AND WOMEN FROM ESTABLISHES & CONTRIBUTES TO THEIR OWN OPERATIONS & THE COMMUNITY. THESE VOLUNTEERS ARE TRAINED BY OUR MAINTENANCE FUND SO THAT WHEN THEY NEED TO MAKE DRILLERS ON MAINTENANCE & REPAIR SO THAT THEY CAN KEEP REPAIRS TO THEIR PROJECTS, NOT ONLY HAVE THEY BEEN THEIR WATER PROJECT ONLINE & OPERABLE FOR DECADES. EACH TRAINED, BUT, ALL PARTS ARE ALWAYS SOURCED LOCALLY, COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTES SWEAT EQUITY TO THE COMPLETION AND WHICH MEANS EACH COMMUNITY IS FINANCIALLY OF THEIR PROJECT TO ENSURE OWNERSHIP. WE PERFORM PUMP ABLE TO DO BASIC MAITENANCE ON THIER WATER PROJECT. TESTS & WATER QUALITY TESTS ON EVERY PROJECT.









ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL

WE DON'T JUST BUILD WELLS. WHILE IT'S TRUE THAT THE VAST MAJORITY OF OUR WATER PROJECTS IN THE FIELD ARE HAND PUMP BOREHOLE WELLS, THERE IS NO "ONE SIZE FITS ALL" SOLUTION FOR BRINGING CLEAN WATER TO A COMMUNITY. SOMETIMES WE BUILD ROBUST RETICULATED OR GRAVITY-FED SYSTEMS WITH MULTIPLE STORAGE TANKS & MULTIPLE ACCESS POINTS THROUGHOUT A COMMUNITY. SOMETIMES WE PROTECT NATURALLY-EXISTING SPRINGS. SOMETIMES WE INSTALL RAINWATER CATCHMENT SYSTEMS. SOMETIMES WE INSTALL BIO SAND WATER FILTERS. SOMETIMES IT'S A COMBINATION OF MULTIPLE SOLUTIONS TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE PEOPLE WE WORK WITH.





MEDIA ETHICS POLICY

WE TAKE TELLING STORIES SERIOUSLY. OVER THE YEARS, THERE HAS BEEN AN INCREASING NEED TO CAPTURE & SHARE CONTENT FROM THE COMMUNITIES WE SERVE IN A MORE ETHICAL WAY. WITH THE RAPID RISE OF DIGITAL MEDIA AND THE INCREASED AND NECESSARY SCRUTINY THAT COMES WITH BEING A U.S. BASED ORGANIZATION WORKING IN RURAL COMMUNITIES INTERNATIONALLY, WE FELT IT WAS IMPORTANT TO DEVELOP A SET OF STANDARDS THAT EVERYONE ON OUR TEAM, BOTH IN THE UNITED STATES & ABROAD, IS TRAINED ON BEFORE CAPTURING AND/OR SHARING CONTENT ON BEHALF OF THIRST PROJECT. WATER TECHNICAL BOARD

ALL OF THIRST PROJECT'S IMPLEMENTING ACTIVITY IS OVERSEEN AND MANAGED BY THE ORGANIZATION'S 'WATER PROJECT TECHNICAL BOARD'. THIS GROUP OF FIVE INDIVIDUALS IS MADE UP OF LEADING EXPERTS IN THE FIELD OF WATER AND SUSTAINABILITY (CIVIL ENGINEERS & HYDROGEOLOGISTS). THIS TEAM IS DEDICATED TO DECIDING WHERE, WHEN & WHAT WE BUILD FOR ALL OF THE WATER PROJECTS WE IMPLEMENT IN THE FIELD. THE BOARD MEETS QUARTERLY TO REVIEW AND APPROVE THE SELECTION OF UPCOMING PROJECTS TO BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE ORGANIZATION IN THE UPCOMING QUARTER. THE BOARD REVIEWS AND APPROVES SITE ASSESSMENTS, QUOTES, AND PLANNED ACTION BEFORE A PROJECT IS FUNDED. AFTER PROJECTS ARE COMPLETE, THEY REVIEW COMPLETED REPORTS, PUMP TESTS, AND WATER QUALITY TESTS FOR EACH SITE.
